

Improve the literacy and numeracy skills of young people aged 14-19

The National Development Programme (NDP) for Young People offers bilingual teaching resources which aim to improve young people's reading, writing, speaking, listening and numeracy skills whilst taking part in a range of different activities:



Sounds Good: The Story of a Band

Learners develop the story of a fictional band from its creation through to achieving fame and fortune – including choosing their band members, planning a tour, writing song lyrics and recording a radio interview.

Child's Play

Aimed at young people who want to study and work in childcare or who may be young parents themselves. Communication and interaction with young children are explored through the medium of toys and games. Sessions include becoming a parent, health and safety with toys and child development.



Storytelling

Explores storytelling, storylines and the origin of myths. Encourage your learners to become involved and create their own stories. Sessions include urban myths, story consequences and writing a children's story.

The Competition

A motivational programme which challenges learners to plan, design and host a sports competition. Learners can either run an actual competition or prepare a detailed presentation of their plans for one to be held in the future.



The Space

Learners plan, design and carry out a makeover of an existing space or build a scale model. Learners develop measuring and costing skills as well as an interest in design.
